

JUDGE VANCE SALTER HONORED BY HISTORY MIAMI AND LEGAL SERVICES OF GREATER MIAMI

Judge Vance E. Salter, of the Third District Court of Appeal, has been named one of the honorees in History Miami's "50 Years, 50 Voices", celebrating the 50-year history of Legal Services of Greater Miami and honoring outstanding community leaders who helped shape that organization.

Legal Services of Greater Miami is the largest provider of broad-based civil legal services for the poor in Miami-Dade and Monroe Counties, and is recognized throughout the state and the nation as a model legal services program. Legal Services of Greater Miami provides innovative, effective legal services which assists thousands of individual members of the community on an annual basis.

Throughout his career, Judge Salter has given life to the words of the oath that each new lawyer must pledge to uphold: "I will never reject, from any consideration personal to myself, the cause of the defenseless or oppressed." While in private practice, Judge Salter worked on a wide variety of cases for the benefit of those otherwise unable to obtain an attorney, including mental health guardianships, postconviction work for an inmate on Alabama's death row, an interstate child custody dispute, and domestic violence cases. He received the "pro bono publico" award from both the Florida Supreme Court and the American Bar Association for his untiring pro bono efforts.

Judge Salter's community service also includes service as a Board member and officer of Legal Services of Greater Miami, Catholic Charities Legal Services, and The Learning Experience School, a school for children and young adults with developmental disabilities. Judge Salter currently serves as co-chair of The Florida Bar Standing Committee on Pro Bono Legal Services and a member of the Miami-Dade Circuit Pro Bono Committee.

Judge Salter was appointed to the Third District Court of Appeal by Governor Charlie Crist in 2007. He is married to Mary Moulis Salter, and they have four children and six grandchildren.
